July 7 – Howard Zinn – **You Can't Be Neutral on a Moving Train** (The life and times of historian, activist and author of *A People's History of the United States*)

July 14 – **Fish Out of Water – What does the Bible**

**really say about being gay?** A film by Ky Dickens who came out to her sorority sisters at Vanderbilt when she was a senior. It explores the seven key passages in the Bible which are used in the debate about homosexuality.

July 21 – Noam Chomsky – **Power and Terror In Our Times** (MIT professor of Linguistics) Chomsky places the 9/11 attacks in the context of American foreign intervention through the postwar decades. Chomsky challenges the US to apply to its own actions the moral standards it demands of others.

July 28 – Daniel Elsberg – **The Most Dangerous Man in America**. The film follows and captures the story of the release of the Pentagon Papers.
